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North Dakota Petroleum Council Report

At the 31st Annual Meeting of the North Dakota
Petroleum Council last month, Dunn County
Commissioner Dale Dukart included some tips for
working with landowners and local governments in his
presentation. These tips are important to consider when
forming a relationship with landowners and
communities.

Tips for working with landowners and local governments

Landowners

Best Practices

- Notify landowner of your intent before you show up at the door (letter, call or e-mail works for most land owners).
- Remember, no answer is the same as NO at the time.
- Always leave a set of documents with the landowner.
- Give the landowner time to read and review the agreement. This could take a week to ten days. Set up another meeting with the landowner to discuss the agreement offered.
- Be willing to discuss this with the landowner's attorney.
- Offer a contact number or e-mail address to the landowner.
- Offer the name of someone in the community with whom you have a working relationship.
- Remember, positive attitudes build strong public perception.
- Try to understand when a landowner, rancher, or farmer is having a bad day. Come back another day if necessary.

Surface Owner Compensation requirements - During the last session of the ND Legislature, legislation introduced by the Northwest Landowners (NWL) stated that surface owners were to be compensated for both the exploration damage to the land and for the annual crop production loss. The legislation passed and the requirements of changes to section 38-11.04 of North Dakota Century Code can be found at http://www.legis.nd.gov/cencode/t38c11-1.pdf. NWL has asked that we remind our members of these changes so that good faith offers can be made to affected surface owners.

Are Landowners Listening? Yes, but often not with both ears.

- Some landowners have a hard time reading and listening to you at the same time.
- Encourage the landowner to have a spouse or friend present during the discussion.
- Never say this is the only chance to landowners. They understand other companies also have offers.

Important Things to Remember

- Money today is not as attractive as it once was.
- Surface owners are concerned about the impacts.
- Many landowners are saying to themselves, "What about the next generation of agriculture production?"
- Small rural towns are challenged daily with growing pains.

Local governments

Tips and Tricks

- · Get to know the decision makers.
- In-kind assistance can help build relationships with counties.
- Become active in the communities. Support at schools, public activities, and to EMS organizations is always welcome and often needed.
- Helping hands build relationships.
- Energy and construction companies need to communicate the why, how's and timeframe of their activities.
- Help the counties prepare for the next steps. Advice is often needed more than financial help from the start.
- Hire the best possible labor force you can.

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AAPL Director's Report

NAPE - Winter NAPE is fast approaching. The dates are February 2-8, 2013. The guest speaker will be J. Gordon Brown, former Prime Minister of Britain and former Minister of Energy. This NAPE should be even better than last year where over 17000 were registered.

Summer NAPE - Over 6487 registrants were at Summer NAPE with 692 booths. This is up from 5,429 in 2011.

NAPE East - The first regional NAPE will be in Pittsburgh April 10-12, 2013. Guest speaker for that is Rocky Bleier, US Army veteran and former Pittsburgh Steeler.

Denver NAPE - The date of the Denver Regional NAPE has been set for October 16-18, 2013. Further details of that event are being developed.

AAPL Committee activities:

 The Forms Committee completed work on a horizontal Joint Operating Agreement. The draft has been distributed for peer review and should be available late this fall.

- Membership Committee reported 16,243 members as of August 14, 2012. Averaging 589 new members per month since June.
- Legislative Committee and Tax
 Committee continue to be busy in a number of States concerning licensing, unlawful practice of law and independent contractor/employee issues.
- The Education Committee is working with the University of Wyoming to establish a PLM program that will tentatively begin in the fall of 2013.

Eighty education seminars were held last year compared to 12 the year before. Also, online seminars are being developed.

 Certification Committee has reviewed 137 applications for the CPL, RPL, and RL designation.
 There are now 2,705 CPLs, 1765 RPLs, and 983 RLs. This committee has recommended to the Board that they redraft the certification tests and will be requiring that anyone taking the test certify that they meet the qualifications to become the designation.

The AAPL office building is being remodeled to provide more office space. The office space is necessary because three positions are being filled. The positions are a corporate development director who will manage the NAPE activities, an IT director, and a senior accountant.

Additional land has been purchased next to the AAPL office building. That land will provide necessary parking and allow for future expansion.

The Annual Meeting is in Washington DC on June 5-8, 2013 at the Grand Hyatt Hotel.
